

Dear faithful of the Cathedral of the Annunciation:

Message from Geli Ioannou, Parish Council President

Greetings in Christ!



AXIOS to his Grace Bishop Constantine of Sassima on his elevation to Bishop. The blessings and joy our community received as we celebrated his elevation will make 2022 a historic year in the life of our beloved Cathedral.

The challenges and struggles of the pandemic are a distant memory, as we look forward to continuing the life of the church. Our Cathedral was blessed to have Father Anastasios Bourantas assigned to be our spiritual Father. In my first conversation with Father Anastasios, his first statement to me was that "it is with love in my heart, and with love in the hearts of my family, that I accepted the assignment". I firmly believe that it was God's will that inspired the events of the past year and I believe we, as a community of faithful, are part of His plan. This is a "call to action" for all of us as a family to be active participants, as we collectively begin to write the next chapter in the life of the Annunciation. Upon his arrival, Father Anastasios reminded us that his arrival was not a "transition" but was the "continuation" of the life of our parish.

There is quite a bit to be excited about as we move forward. Change can often usher in a new sense of life and purpose and that is what I feel and sense in our parish. The life and ministries of the church are vibrant with activity. I recognize that the ministries and organizations of the church need to be nurtured and supported, and the Parish Council is committed to this purpose. I also recognize that it is time for substantial investment into the Education Building and the entire lower level of the Cathedral. These facilities have served us well, but they need to be modernized with a vision and purpose that is going to support the needs of our children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. This is where the heartbeat of our ministries and organizations lives, and this is where we enjoy fellowship as a community. Father Anastasios and the Parish Council are eager and excited to engage our fellow parishioners in discussions that will ultimately define our vision for the future. The Capital Campaign Committee has been working to prepare to relaunch, once the scope of our vision is clearly defined. This process will be challenging and exciting. It will require that everyone has an opportunity to share their thoughts and opinions.

As excited as I am about beginning this process, we have a challenge. We must determine what needs to be done with the five vacant row homes across the street from the Cathedral. There was a vision for development in 2006 and a capital campaign was initiated, but the collapse of the economy in 2008 brought that effort to a halt. We must resolve the issue of what to do with these properties, before proceeding with renovations to the Cathedral side of the street. We owe this to our neighbors and to our community. Seeking a resolution, will be a part of forthcoming conversations and the focus of the Spring General Assembly scheduled for May 7, 2023. We have several options. We can sell them and allow an investor to control what is developed there. We can partner with an investor and secure partial use and partial ownership. We can choose to develop for the purpose of expanding ministries into the space and maintain ownership. We can develop for commercial or residential use and maintain ownership. We can seek approval to demolish them and create an outdoor space that connects to the AOC.

A tremendous amount of work has been done to explore all our options. I am grateful to everyone who has offered their time and talents to this effort. I look forward to sharing more details when we have the opportunity to meet. We are blessed to be the stewards of this beautiful Cathedral. We are the beneficiaries of the Greek immigrants who mortgaged their homes to purchase this magnificent church. They had a vision for what the church they purchased would someday transform into, and many who sacrificed, never saw the fruits of their labor. They did it for future generations to come. That's us. It's time to create our vision for future generations. Through prayer and with love, we will set the course for the next hundred years. I wish everyone a blessed Lent.

Philoptochos is as busy as ever in 2023!

We kicked off this year with the Annual Vasilopita distribution in the Cathedral followed by a reception on January 8th. Trina Madani was blessed to receive the Vasilopita coin. Connie Rogers and Alexis Grote gifted Trina with a cross.

On February 25th we hosted a Metropolis-wide event at the AOC. Our Chapter hosted Dorrie Papadimitriou, founder of MudGirls Studio in Atlantic City, NJ. Dorrie is a member of the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church in Egg Harbor Township, NJ, and past president of their Philoptochos Chapter. In 2016, Dorrie started a program for disenfranchised women to learn a skill and earn a supplemental income to lift them up from addiction or homelessness. She taught



women how to work with clay at a homeless shelter, Adelaide's Place in Atlantic City. From this experience she got the idea to start her own non-profit where women can work in a safe environment surrounded by love. MudGirls Studio produces beautiful works of art in utilitarian items as well as full wall tile installations in educational institutions and large corporations.

We invited all 55 Philoptochos Chapters in the NJ Metropolis to the event. There were 82 attendees with at least one representative from every state in the Metropolis. Dorrie was accompanied by three of her MudGirls, two of whom have been working in the program since 2016. They shared their stories of homelessness and past addiction and recovery. One of the women shared that at one point many years ago she was homeless in Baltimore and this was the first time she had been back to Baltimore since that time. This time she returned as a full-time employee of MudGirls with her own apartment and sharing her story with the attendees. We also watched a beautiful documentary about MudGirls, that was both heartwarming and inspiring. Lunch was offered and then we went up to the balcony for an opportunity to be a MudGirl for the day. Three stations were set up where participants worked with the clay to produce a dove ornament that was taken back to the studio to be processed in their inventory. An afternoon would not be complete without shopping. A boutique was set up where we had the opportunity to purchase some of the beautiful items crafted at the MudGirls Studio. I think it is safe to say that everyone who attended had a wonderful time experiencing Philoptochos sisterhood and philanthropy.

Pastoral Reminders

Prosforon (Holy Communion Bread) - One of the great honors for a family is to bake Prosforon to be used for the Divine Liturgy. Please contact the Cathedral office if you would like to provide Prosforon.



Coffee Hour - Contact the Cathedral Office if you would like to host or co-host a Coffee Hour on Sunday.

Sacramental Wine and Altar Supplies - You may make a financial gift to help defray the cost of the sacramental wine that is used for Holy Communion. Please note on the memo line of your check or on the envelope "Sacramental Wine". The donation is \$150.00, which may be offered in memory or in honor of a loved one. For additional information, contact the Cathedral office.

Forty Day Baby Blessing - Contact the Cathedral Office to schedule the service. These blessings take place immediately after the Divine Liturgy and families should plan to arrive at the Cathedral no later than 9:30 am. Ushers will have seating available for you and will direct you when it is time for the service.

Sunday School - All youth are invited to participate in the Religious Education program at the Cathedral. Pews are reserved for students in the Cathedral during the Divine Liturgy to the left of the Altar. Once the students receive Holy Communion, they will be escorted to their respective classrooms for the lesson. The students will be brought down at 11:15 am to the sanctuary or at the conclusion of the Divine liturgy to receive antideron and be dismissed (whichever is the later).

Altar Boys - Young men, ages 8 and above are encouraged to serve in the Altar. Dress code is dark trousers, black dress shoes, white long-sleeved dress shirt and conservative tie. They should arrive no later than 9:30 am and must receive a blessing from the presiding priest before serving. Altar boys will be dismissed for Sunday School once they receive communion when Sunday School is in session.

Memorial Services - Kindly contact the Cathedral two weeks prior to schedule a memorial service for your loved one. Be mindful that conflicts sometimes do occur due to the ecclesiastical calendar of the Orthodox Church. It is up to the family to prepare and distribute the koliva (boiled wheat) unless other arrangements have been made with the Philoptochos (contact Georgeann Morekas, 443-845-1176). Flowers and koliva should be at the Cathedral no later than 9:00 am on Sunday morning. Pews will be reserved in the center for family members on a first come basis. Father Anastasios will visit the Greek Orthodox Cemetery on Windsor Mill Road first, then the other burial sites unless prior arrangements have been made. If flowers are ordered, it is the family's responsibility to take them to the gravesite.

Death - When a death occurs in the family, contact the funeral home of your choice and Father Anastasios. Arrangements for the funeral will be made in conjunction with the funeral home and Father Anastasios.

Hospital and Nursing Home Visits - It is up to the family to notify Father Anastasios when a visit is necessary. It is advised to contact him immediately by calling 410-727-1831. If it is a medical emergency and the office is closed, the emergency telephone number will be given. Due to legal obligations and privacy laws he is not at liberty to offer information regarding a parishioner.

Parking - Parking on the Cathedral lots are reserved only for Cathedral activities. If there are no activities, the lots are closed. Cars left on the lot, regardless of parking permit, will be towed at the owner's expense.

Electronic/Written Communications - All communications that are disseminated through the parish are done with the consent and blessing of Father Anastasios. The e-mail listserv is a private listing that only contains Patriarchal/Archdiocesan/Metropolis and Cathedral information. It is not used to advertise for private business. The sole purpose is to keep our parishioners informed about relevant events in the life of our parish. Death announcements are sent only if the funeral takes place at the Cathedral or our Cemetery Chapel.

Social Services Assistance - The Philoptochos has resources available to those who require social services assistance. All requests are confidential and can be submitted to: philoptochos@annuncationbaltimore.org; or leave a message at the church.

Good Standing - If you have already obtained a civil divorce, you must also receive an Ecclesiastical Divorce from the Church. This brief process is confidentially handled by the parish priest and must be completed in order to be in good standing with the Church, meaning that you may not partake in the Sacramental life of the Church (ex: being a sponsor at a wedding or baptism, receiving Holy Communion, Holy Unction, serving on Parish Council, voting at Parish Assemblies, and entering into another marriage). Please consider your personal situation and be in good standing with the Church. If you have questions or concerns please contact Fr. Anastasios directly.

Steward of the Parish - As Orthodox Christians we are stewards of the Church not merely members. Stewardship is our lifetime commitment to our Church that begins at baptism (Chrismation for some) and continues annually when we financially, physically, and spiritually contribute and participate in the life of the Church. Our Stewardship Pledge is made as a grateful response for what God has given us through Christ. All parishioners over 18 years of age who submit a stewardship commitment and remain current with that commitment during the year will be considered voting members of the parish. All members of a household who are over the age of 18 should submit their own stewardship commitment. More rights and responsibilities of our stewards are outlined in the charters and by-laws of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, Metropolis of New Jersey, and the Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation.






The Hellenic Heritage Museum of Maryland, Inc.





HISTORIC MILESTONES OF OUR COMMUNITY

Did you know...

▶ 2023 marks the 86th Anniversary of the purchase of our beautiful Cathedral building. We have been worshipping here for more than 3/4 of a century! Our magnificent edifice was slated for demolition to make way for a gasoline station. We acquired the building for \$40,500 (a huge sum of money in 1937) and saved it for future generations of Orthodox Christians!



"Famous Old Church is Renovated by New Owners," The Baltimore Sun, May 6, 1937

- ▶ 2023 marks the 111th Anniversary of the historic "Greek Circle." This first Orthodox burial ground in the State of Maryland is located within the picturesque Woodlawn Cemetery off of Gwynn Oak Avenue. Over 600 of our earliest parishioners are buried there; only 250 received markers. "Gone But Not Forgotten" (2001) tells the story and documents all the burials as a memorial tribute.
- ▶ 111 years ago, a prominent parishioner named James Conits was murdered by another Greek who was attempting to rob his home. The Greek colony joined in the search for the killer who was apprehended and died shortly after. The sensational nature of the crime was detailed in over 12 newspaper articles. The tombstone for Mr. Conits, who was born in 1853, is the oldest monument in the Greek Circle at Woodlawn.
- ▶ 111 years ago, Greek communities across America were encouraging volunteers to return to the homeland to join Greece and its Allies in the fight against Turkey. The Balkan Wars (1912-1913) brought out the patriotism of many Greeks. A newspaper article from October 1912 recounts a special gathering at the Homewood Avenue Church to raise money and mobilize volunteers!
- ▶ Nearly 130 years ago, in 1893, there was an attempt to establish an Orthodox Church in Baltimore. Recently discovered newspaper articles beautifully describe the interior of the "Chapel of St. John the Baptist" located at 403 South Bond Street in Fells Point. Had that early venture been successful, we would have been the fourth Greek Orthodox church in America—following only New Orleans, New York and Chicago!

The above milestones were prepared by Parish Historian Nicholas M. Prevas. The rich and colorful history of the Cathedral of the Annunciation has been well-documented with splendid photographs in the Centennial publication, "House of God...Gateway to Heaven" (2007). We are among a handful of parishes fortunate enough to have our history recorded for us. Autographed copies of these books are available for purchase. We sincerely thank Nick Prevas for the passion he continues to put forth in his volunteer work for our community.
