

Message from Ernie Rafailides, Parish Council President



Χριστός Ανέστη. We have completed our journey through Lent and have celebrated the glorious resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. During the last 60 days not only have we been preparing mentally, spiritually, and physically for the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, but we have also experienced change – mainly a change in leadership.

On behalf of the Parish Council, I want to thank the entire community for welcoming Father George, Presvytera Evelyn, and their adult children, John-Mark, Sophia, and Constantine to our Cathedral Family. We appreciate everyone's involvement and support as we transition to new clerical leadership.

The path of change will continue this Spring. For the first time in the Cathedral's history, we will hold our Festival over the Memorial Day weekend at the end of May. Please reach out to Geli Ioannou to volunteer. Over the next couple of months, Father George will start meeting with all our committees and continue planning for this year and start planning for next. I would encourage committees who have not had a chance to meet with Father George to reach out to the office and set up a meeting with him. All committees, unless specifically authorized by the Uniform Parish Regulations, work under the authority of the Parish Council. If a committee has been dormant or needs to be re-authorized, please reach out to the Parish Council. The Parish Council has already received a request to re-establish the Iconography and Beautification Committee. That request and others regarding committees will be taken into consideration during our May and June meetings. There will be another first this May. On May 11, 2024, the Cathedral will host the Metropolis Final of the St. John Chrysostom Festival. Corinna Vlahoyiannis is heading the Host Committee. We thank Corinna for her efforts and for representing our Cathedral. His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos will be in attendance.

On June 23, 2024, the Feast of Pentecost will celebrate the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, the establishment of the Church, and the baptism of those who believed in Jesus Christ. Our current committees are working hard to serve Christ, our Church, and our community. The Capital Campaign Committee officially hired Lou Baird and Associates to act as consultants and guide us as we plan for the renovation projects that will transform our Cathedral campus. The Capital Campaign Committee has also been working hard on their request for funding to the Stavros Niarchos Foundation. The Building and Maintenance Committee meets every month and is constantly working on issues in the Cathedral's Sanctuary, the Education Building, the Annunciation Orthodox Center, and the Cemetery. Some of the repair items the Building and Maintenance Committee is handling include but are not limited to slate repair at the AOC, leaking water at the AOC, evaluating roof estimates for the Education building, and finalizing and seeking approval for a new Hot Water system in the Education Building. Again, we have many committees and ministries working hard, there is just not enough space to mention all that is being done.

When the Holy Spirit ascended upon the Apostles during Pentecost, they were given the ability to speak in foreign tongues and were charged to go forth, spread the Gospel, and establish the Church. Every committee and ministry should focus on this mission. Now is the time to not only embrace the change in our Cathedral life but also in your spiritual life and get involved with a committee or ministry to spread the glorious message of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If there is a committee or ministry that the Cathedral does not offer and you are interested in getting involved and starting, please talk to Father George and the Parish Council. With more than 40 ministries and committees that are part of our Cathedral Family. Thank you to all the committee members for their tireless and dedicated efforts.

On behalf of the Parish Council and our Parish, I want to thank Axion Charities for their generous donation of \$16,000.00. Those funds will be used to buy a new freezer for the AOC, integrate the access systems of the Cathedral and Annunciation Orthodox Center, and a couple of other smaller projects. I also want to thank the Parish for their contribution to Father John's gift. The Cathedral family contributed just over \$2,000.00 to Father John as he started his ministry at Saints Peter and Paul in Frederick, MD.







Historical Remembrances...

135th Anniversary of the design and construction of a Romanesque architectural masterpiece! The Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation

This year marks the 135th Anniversary of the construction of our Cathedral building, designed by famed architect Charles E. Cassell in the Romanesque style. It was built in 1889 for the Associate Reformed Church, a Protestant congregation, that worshipped in this sacred space for over 40 years. As a Protestant denomination, the first church services were held in 1890 at this location.

Cases 1 & 2 in the new Main Lobby display, presented by Parish Historian Nicholas M. Prevas, tells the fascinating history of the Protestants on Preston Street with specific details about the installation of the four magnificent Tiffany windows which were dedicated between 1894-1903. You will also learn how two Protestant parishes merged in 1900, which led to the church name being changed to the Associate Congregational Church of Baltimore.

Case 3 will give you a glimpse into the acquisition of this historic church building by the Greek Orthodox community in 1937. Did you know it was slated to be demolished to become a gasoline station after the Protestants relocated to Bolton Hill? The corner of Maryland Avenue and Preston Street soon became the new center of religious and social life for the Greeks of Baltimore. Then, in the spring of 1938, the "Evangelismos" (Annunciation) Church was consecrated by Archbishop Athenagoras in an impressive dedicatory service followed by a grand celebration.

Case 4 highlights our church's elevation to Cathedral status in the spring of 1975 by proclamation of Archbishop Iakovos that was read by Bishop Silas on the Sunday of Orthodoxy that year. In addition, the most historic event in our Cathedral history – the visit of Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew to Baltimore in the fall of 1997 – is shown with photographs and interesting documents highlighting that auspicious occasion.

This Main Lobby display will be up throughout 2024. All parishioners, both young and old, are encouraged to not only enjoy but to learn the interesting history of our Cathedral which made it what it is today. The display is enhanced with detailed captions which provide a structured guide to the information being presented. Thank you again, Nick, for creating this superb educational experience for our community!

2024 STEWARDSHIP COMMITMENT



How do I become a steward of the parish?

As Orthodox Christians we are stewards of the Church not merely members. Stewardship is our lifetime commitment to our Church that begins at baptism (Chrismation for some) and continues annually when we financially, physically, and spiritually contribute and participate in the life of the Church. Our stewardship pledge is made as a grateful response for what God has given us through Christ. All parishioners over 18 years of age who submit a stewardship commitment and remain current with that commitment during the year will be considered voting members of the parish. All members of a household who are over the age of 18 should submit their own stewardship commitment whether online or through this form. More rights and responsibilities of our stewards are outlined in the charters and by-laws of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, Metropolis of New Jersey, and the Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation.

What is our Stewardship Goal?

Our Stewardship Goal is to fund Parish ministries 100% through stewardship contributions. Though we may meet our Stewardship Goal, we may still host the festival and other events for reasons other than fundraising such as fellowship, proclaiming our faith, etc.

Do I need to fill out a pledge form?

YES! The only way to quantify both how many families we have in our church and how much revenue we can expect to raise through stewardship is by having each member fill out a stewardship commitment form or submit the ONLINE stewardship commitment form.

What if I cannot fulfill my stewardship commitment?

During the course of a year, circumstances change. Your stewardship is valued because it is made out of your love for God and His Church. Please do not be concerned if you are unable to meet your stewardship commitment – we are glad you are a part of this parish.

STEWARDSHIP 2024

Dear Faithful of the Cathedral of the Annunciation,

2023 Stewardship: Stewardship revenue in December 2023 was strong and it helped our parish achieve about 95% of the stewardship revenue goal in 2023. Total stewardship revenue was about \$772,000 from about 500 faithful stewards. About 57 stewards met the \$3500 milestone to qualify as Day Sponsor and about 52 stewards met the \$1750 milestone to qualify as a Half-day Sponsor. We are grateful for the contributions from all our stewards. As you may deduce from the statistics of years past, individual contributions are more meaningful today.

2024 Stewardship: The Stewardship Committee encourages all parishioners to consider reaching a Day Sponsor or Half-day Sponsor milestone in 2024. Each contribution from a parishioner/family has a great impact on the ministries of our parish. Covering the expenses of the parish either for a day with a \$3500 annual pledge or half-day with a \$1750 annual pledge may be personally gratifying in addition to a significant contribution to help maintain our common expectations of our parish. Stewardship is the giving of Time, Treasure, and Talent. It is giving back to God for the gifts He has given to you. Day or Half-day Sponsorship may not be within everyone's capabilities, but if it is within your household, please be "one of the ones" who allow us to meet our 2024 Stewardship goal and help make progress on our long-term goal of funding all parish costs from stewardship.



- Sacramental Wine and Altar Supplies You may make a financial gift to help defray the cost of the sacramental wine that is used for Holy Communion. Please note on the memo line of your check or on the envelope "Sacramental Wine". The donation is \$150.00, which may be offered in memory or in honor of a loved one. REMINDER

- Forty Day Baby Blessing Contact the Cathedral Office to schedule the service. These blessings take place immediately after the Divine Liturgy and families should plan to arrive at the Cathedral no later than 9:30 am. Ushers will have seating available for you and will direct you when it is time for the service.
- **Sunday School** All youth are invited to participate in the Religious Education program at the Cathedral. Pews are reserved for students in the Cathedral during the Divine Liturgy to the left of the Altar. Once the students receive Holy Communion, they will be escorted to their respective classrooms for the lesson. Sunday School will end at 11:30am or after the Divine Liturgy, whichever is the later. The children will be brought down to receive Antidoron and be dismissed from the church.
- Altar Boys Young men, ages 8 and above are encouraged to serve in the Altar. Dress code is dark trousers, black dress shoes, white long-sleeved dress shirt and conservative tie. They should arrive no later than 9:30 am and must receive a blessing from the presiding priest before serving. Altar boys will be dismissed for Sunday School once they receive communion when Sunday School is in session.
- Memorial Services Kindly contact the Cathedral two weeks prior to schedule a memorial service for your loved one. Be mindful that conflicts sometimes do occur due to the ecclesiastical calendar of the Orthodox Church. It is up to the family to prepare and distribute the koliva (boiled wheat) unless other arrangements have been made with the Philoptochos (contact Georgeann Morekas, 443-845-1176). Flowers and koliva should be at the Cathedral no later than 9:00 am on Sunday morning. Pews will be reserved in the center for family members on a first come basis. Father George will visit the Greek Orthodox Cemetery on Windsor Mill Road first, then the other burial sites unless prior arrangements have been made. If flowers are ordered, it is the family's responsibility to take them to the gravesite.
- **Death** When a death occurs in the family, contact the funeral home of your choice and Father George. Arrangements for the funeral will be made in conjunction with the funeral home and Father George.
- Hospital and Nursing Home Visits It is up to the family to notify Father George when a visit is necessary. It is advised to contact him immediately by calling 410-727-1831. If it is a medical emergency and the office is closed, the emergency telephone number will be given. Due to legal obligations and privacy laws he is not at liberty to offer information regarding a parishioner.
- **Parking** Parking on the Cathedral lots are reserved only for Cathedral activities. If there are no activities, the lots are closed. Cars left on the lot, regardless of parking permit, will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Electronic/Written Communications All communications that are disseminated through the parish are done with the consent and blessing of Father George. The e-mail listserv is a private listing that only contains Patriarchal/Archdiocesan/Metropolis and Cathedral information. It is not used to advertise for private business. The sole purpose is to keep our parishioners informed about relevant events in the life of our parish. Death announcements are sent only if the funeral takes place at the Cathedral or our Cemetery Chapel.
- Social Services Assistance The Philoptochos has resources available to those who require social services assistance. All requests are confidential and can be submitted to: <u>philoptochos@annuncationbaltimore.org</u>; or <u>Fr.George@annunciationbaltimore.org</u>; or leave a message at the church.
- **Good Standing** If you have already obtained a civil divorce, you must also receive an Ecclesiastical Divorce from the Church. This brief process is confidentially handled by the parish priest and must be completed in order to be in good standing with the Church, meaning that you may not partake in the Sacramental life of the Church (ex: being a sponsor at a wedding or baptism, receiving Holy Communion, Holy Unction, serving on Parish Council, voting at Parish Assemblies, and entering into another marriage). Please consider your personal situation and be in good standing with the Church. If you have questions or concerns please contact Fr. George directly.
- Steward of the Parish As Orthodox Christians we are stewards of the Church not merely members. Stewardship is our lifetime commitment to our Church that begins at baptism (Chrismation for some) and continues annually when we financially, physically, and spiritually contribute and participate in the life of the Church. Our Stewardship Pledge is made as a grateful response for what God has given us through Christ. All parishioners over 18 years of age who submit a stewardship commitment and remain current with that commitment during the year will be considered voting members of the parish. All members of a household who are over the age of 18 should submit their own stewardship commitment. More rights and responsibilities of our stewards are outlined in the charters and by-laws of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, Metropolis of New Jersey, and the Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Annunciation.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR THE FOLLOWING SCAM/PHISHING

Phishing is a cybercrime in which a target or targets are contacted by email, telephone or text message by someone posing as a legitimate institution to lure individuals into providing sensitive data such as personally identifiable information, banking and credit card details, and passwords.

The information is then used to access important accounts and can result in identity theft and financial loss.

Common Features of Phishing Emails:

1. <u>Too Good To Be True</u> - Lucrative offers and eye-catching or attention-grabbing statements are designed to attract people's attention immediately. For instance, many claim that you have won an iPhone, a lottery, or some other lavish prize. Just don't click on any suspicious emails. Remember that if it seems to good to be true, it probably is!

2. <u>Sense of Urgency</u> - A favorite tactic amongst cybercriminals is to ask you to act fast because the super deals are only for a limited time. Some of them will even tell you that you have only a few minutes to respond. When you come across these kinds of emails, it's best to just ignore them. Sometimes, they will tell you that your account will be suspended unless you update your personal details immediately. Most reliable organizations give ample time before they terminate an account and they never ask patrons to update personal details over the Internet. When in doubt, visit the source directly rather than clicking a link in an email.

3. <u>Hyperlinks</u> - A link may not be all it appears to be. Hovering over a link shows you the actual URL where you will be directed upon clicking on it. It could be completely different or it could be a popular website with a misspelling, for instance www.bankofarnerica.com - the 'm' is actually an 'r' and an 'n', so look carefully.

<u>Attachments</u> - If you see an attachment in an email you weren't expecting or that doesn't make sense, don't open it! They often contain payloads like ransomware or other viruses. The only file type that is always safe to click on is a .txt file.
 <u>Unusual Sender</u> - Whether it looks like it's from someone you don't know or someone you do know, if anything seems out of the ordinary, unexpected, out of character or just suspicious in general don't click on it!
